# Do You Know You Are To Be One Of The Sheep?"

#### **Foundational Review**

Four sessions ago we studied the Sanctuary, which illustrated the Covenant Grace-Faith Relationship for us personally, removing the penalty, the power, and the presence of sin in our lives so

that we are enabled to stand before God with confidence by Faith

in His ability to do what He has promised.

Three sessions ago we studied the Three Angels' Messages, which illustrated

this same Covenant Grace-Faith Relationship as we present it to others, inviting them 1) to worship God, 2) to make a choice to come out of the world's orientation to life and to enter into/abide in God's plan of salvation, and 3) to receive the wonderful consequence of making that choice — everlasting life with our best Friend.

Two sessions ago we began working through the basic, real life applications of this Christian life, to grasp the idea that Seventh-day Adventist Christians (to be the Remnant that they are called to be) must be living this Christian life in the Time of the End. In these last four sessions we are studying what this life will actually will look like.

Two sessions ago we studied Making Disciples, like Abraham made disciples. Last session we studied Being a Witness, like the Wild Man became a witness. This week is an unusual title: Being One of the Sheep. Be sure you read Chapter 17 before working through this study. The discussion we are about to have will be much easier, because some of the questions are asking for ideas directly from the chapter.

## Part 1: On the Mount of Olives Matthew 24:1-14

Turn to Matt. 24. In this session we will spend most of our time here.
